Woodland Trust

Helped by the WI in 2018 we applied for 450 free saplings from the Woodland Trust, their Large Wild-life Pack (Hawthorn, Rowan, Blackthorn, Silver Birch, Hazel & Common Oak), which arrived in March and Luke planted them. We are replacing trees which over the years have come down and also those felled due to ash dieback. The need to fill the gaps was becoming more urgent to sustain the quality of the environment for the wild life and the pleasure for the sisters & guests who walk around the woods. The saplings have done very well and are growing, we have applied for another 350 saplings for another area of the woods.

Seville Marmalade



In 2018 we were unable to obtain any Seville Oranges for making marmalade which was sorely missed by our customers. This year Sevilles were purchased. Our Marmalade is the best selling preserve.

Fruit & Vea

This year we have been enjoying a good growing season, with an early spring, vegetables were sown earlier than usual and got off to a flying start. In May we were able to sell the Charlottes (early potatoes) they went very well, followed by French beans, Tomatoes, Cucumbers, Courgettes, & Marrows The Blackcurrants have yielded an excellent crop and are in the freezer for Jam & Jelly making, Sr's Edith & Usia are also making blackcurrant and apple juice.

OCSO Region of the Isles Junior's Seminar2019


